MODERN UNITED NATION (MUN)





Firstly, we are introduced to the Model United Nations as one of the most influential activities for students throughout Amman. One of the NOS students gave us his point of view about last year's experience in Italy. "Who knew that a 2715 km difference could mean an introduction to a whole new cultural world? We were going with the mentality that Italy would be the home where art, history and elegance were met as well as our expectations. You could be overwhelmed by their hospitality, or mesmerized by the perfectly carved infrastructure, or even catch yourself staring into paintings that date back to a different era. Although what kept me interested was how they kept their history alive, unlike other countries who abandon their traditions. Italians still occupy historical buildings as an everyday residence. Meaning truly, that when in Rome, do as Romans do."



What Is Model United Nation (MUN)?

The MUN club was established in 2006, and is a student club run by the school's students. It is made up of several committees, and its aim is to adopt the same concepts of the United Nation

The selection includes many processes, such as writing an article about a certain topic, in which they share their opinions and argue about the topic, whether they're with it or against. This showcases their debating skills, followed by an interview. The MUN members' traits include high ethics and a high academic standard. If the member didn't uphold this standard, they would be dismissed from the club

This club holds an annual conference
[NOSMUN] in which they discuss and debate the
main issues that are being discussed in the UN's
committees. Each member will represent a
country and role-play delegates, and each
participant's opinion must be the same as his or
her country

The school's MUN club is affiliated with other MUN clubs around the country, and around the world. The club participates effectively in every conference in Jordan, and annually travels around the world to participate in conferences around the world. These countries include Italy, Hungary, Great Britain, Lebanon and Holland. Last year, the club went to Genoa, Italy and Budapest, Hungary.
